One of Biggest Experiences this month would have to be the Winter tour that our rotary group and three other rotary groups from Australia as well as, south Africa and Brazil. On this tour we went around to a few major towns and City's touring most of Germany for a week, then we would drive down to Austria and go skiing in the alps for three days. Now the biggest part about December is that it's Christmas time. And here in Germany they celebrate it a little differently. Firstly, Nicholas comes on the sixth of December and put chocolate and other presents in your shoes when you leave them out. One condition though, they have to be really clean otherwise you will get nothing. Next on the twenty fourth the typical German family will go to church and after church has finished then Christmas officially begins so when you get home you will have dinner and then open all your presents. Now on the twenty fifth its Christmas day for us in Australia and here in Germany. Lastly the twenty sixth is pretty much the same as the twenty fifth with eating food and gathering with friends and family.

FIRST UNOFFICIAL MEETING BACK FOR 2025










