ONGOING PROGRAMS FOR 224-2025

The Rotary Club of Cessnock are dedicated to addressing the diverse needs within our community through a variety of programs. THE BIKE PROJECT

The Rotary Club of Cessnock commenced a Bike Project in 2021, which aimed to provide bicycles that have been donated then repaired and serviced at no cost to children in the community whose families lack the financial means to purchase their own. This program grew to providing bicycles to any member of the community who needed one and didn't have the means to purchase their own. Through this initiative, we seek to promote accessibility, independence, and mobility for all members of our community, regardless of their socio-economic status or physical abilities. The Bicycle Project has been a cornerstone of our efforts to empower individuals and families in the Cessnock area. Over the past three years, we have distributed bicycles to community members in need, allowing them to commute, exercise, and explore their surroundings with ease. Building on the success of this program, we are now expanding our efforts to develop specialised bicycles for individuals with significant physical disabilities, ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to experience the joy and freedom of cycling.

SCONE TIME

In 2021 The Rotary Club of Cessnock initiated an ongoing program titled Scone Time aimed at fostering community spirit and support. This program offers a free morning tea, featuring freshly baked scones served with jam and cream, along with coffee or tea. It is specifically designed for those in the community who may be feeling lonely, isolated, or who are new to the area. Scone Time provides a warm and welcoming environment where community members can

come together, socialise, and build connections. The program not only addresses social isolation but also helps newcomers integrate into the community. It serves as a platform for creating friendships and support networks.

BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAM

Breakfast and Lunch program commenced in 2021. Originally launched as a free lunch from our BBQ in an outdoor area, this initiative has significantly expanded due to its positive impact and growing demand. The program now includes a hot breakfast and a three-course lunch, hosted in the Uniting Church Community Hall. This venue provides a welcoming, café-like atmosphere, enhancing the dining experience. The primary objective of Breakfast Lunch is to support the most vulnerable members of our community, offering them not only nutritious meals but also a sense of dignity and belonging.




