Lovedale long lunch



Rotary Club of Cessnock was providing breakfast and lunch for the Australian Light Aircraft Championships at the Cessnock Aerodrome.



They are safe and easy to fly for pilots within a wide range of experience and proficiency, but harder to fly accurately! A qualified flight instructor occupies the right-hand seat as an air judge in the landing and streamer cutting events.
